The U14 Leinster team travelled to Edinburgh on Friday 24th February to compete in the Celtic Challenge against Ulster, Lothian and Wales. After a late night on Friday due to a delayed flight, the team was up and ready to face Ulster. The first match began with a shaky start; however, the team settled and beat Ulster 11-4. After lunch, which was provided by the host, Lothian, Leinster played Lothian and took the win 13-2. The final match of the competition was against Wales on Sunday morning, which Leinster won 14-1.





For most of the players, this was their first trip abroad to compete in a badminton competition, and all the players handled themselves like Pros. There were stand-out performances throughout the weekend from all the players involved. In total, Leinster won 38 matches out of a total of 45. Of these 38 matches, 37 were won in straight sets.
