



Dublin Schools Badminton Review 2023 -2024

Dublin Schools Badminton have had another good year. Nearly all schools are back to extracurricular activities and sports following Covid. This year again, we have had over 50 schools taking part in all ages U14, U16, and U19. 283 teams took part and that is an increase from last year. This is encouraging, as schools are building more sports halls so in turn more students have the facilities to play badminton. Unfortunately, we have also lost some Schools due to time constraints with teachers getting off for matches. It is easier for coaches to facility matches rather than teaches. It was difficult to find staff to bring the students to matches due to staff storages. This year we noticed that age groups were divided out to three teachers due to work commitments. We followed the same format as last year for the DSB League.

As you can see there is an increase of just over 20 teams in the last 2 yrs. A few schools had to pull out at the beginning of the season.

Review of the League: DSB require to revise standards of division of play with Leinster. It was noticed this year there weren't as many teams in Division 1 and 2. We had a lot of Division 4 and 5 players which was great, but DSB will have to tighten up on the level of play. Many schools were too strong for Division 4 and 5.

This is something that should be looked at, and also the standard of Divisions going forward looked at for future alignments of standard of players.

Next Steps:

- Instate teacher training – advice on leading sessions with large numbers, especially the scoring system for teachers. Also, students don't have to use flip charts for league matches.
- Encourage teachers to get involved, even in a small capacity in their schools.
